- 8. As he walks through the empty streets, he looks into the brightly lit houses and sees that they are filled with happy children celebrating Christmas.





Middle Climax The most exciting or intense part for the characters. The conflict is addressed.	
End Falling action The events leading to the resolution of the conflict. Resolution How the conflict is solved and how the story ends.
